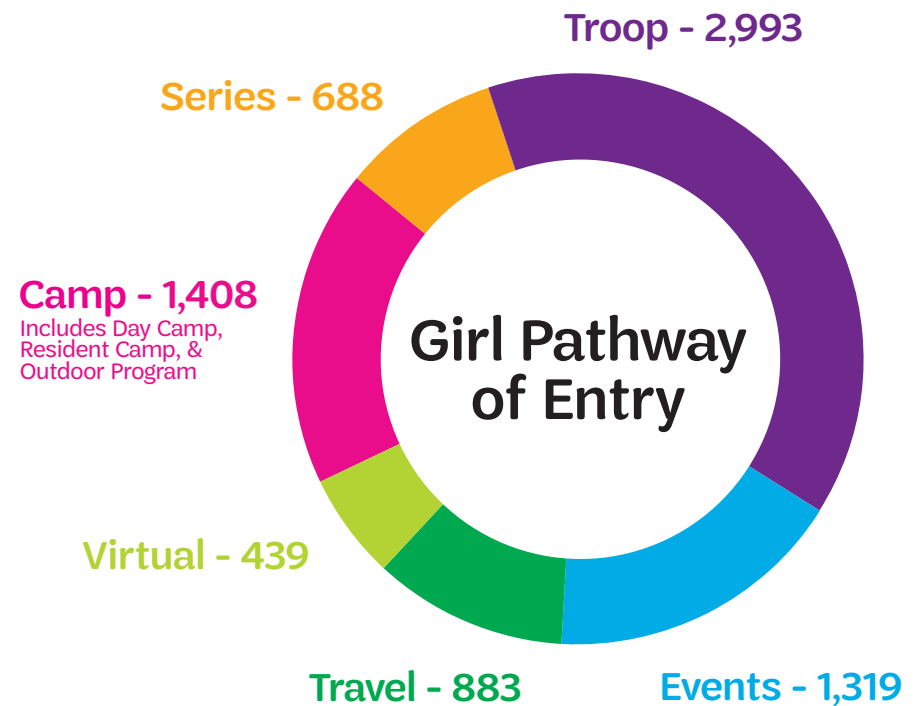

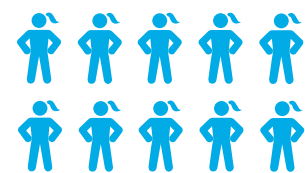
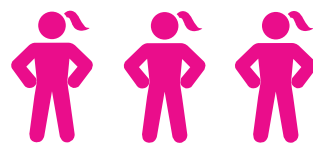

## Girls in STEM

Girl Scout Troops 3325 and 4317 qualified for the Eastern Washington FIRST LEGO League (FLL) State Championship tournament. They built, tested, and programmed autonomous robots using technology to solve a set of missions. Both teams operated under the FLL signature set of Core Values, celebrating discovery, teamwork, and Gracious Professionalism®.



337 participants attended Spooky Science at the Girl Scout Program Center. Girls engaged in various STEM activities that taught about sublimation, polymers, energy, and phosphorescence.

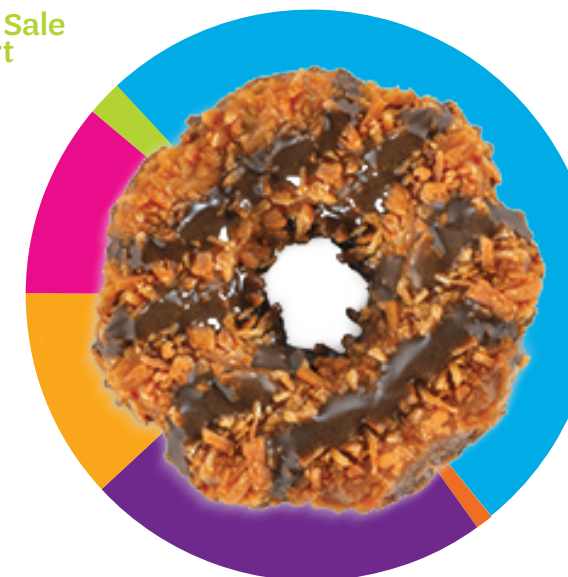
