



Free Camp Tours and Barbeque at Camp Four Echoes Family Fun Day Bring the family for a day at Lake Coeur d'Alene June 22

(Spokane, WA–June 14, 2013): There's no better time to register your girl for summer resident camp at the lake than right now! Girl Scouts Eastern Washington and Northern Idaho is hosting an annual Family Fun Day at Camp Four Echoes at Lake Coeur d'Alene, Saturday, June 22, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. It's a full day of fun, exploration, activities and a FREE barbeque for the entire family. Tour the camp, meet the camp staff, explore the waterfront activities and enjoy a BBQ on the lodge deck or lawn just footsteps from the lake.

Camp Four Echoes is a Girl Scout owned and operated camp located at Windy Bay at Lake Coeur d'Alene. This 212 acre wooded resident camp features more than a mile of waterfront, themed cabins, a modern main lodge with high touch art and science rooms, certified ropes course, hiking trails, water activity equipment, archery range and all the great adventures girls in grades 1-12 could imagine.

Camp sessions begin June 23 and run through August 9. Each session* has a unique theme such as:

CSI@C4E: solve a mystery using forensic science tools such as fingerprinting and casting footprints.

Survivor Girl: Tame the wild and learn to survive with style. Make the tools you need to conquer the outdoors. Learn to cook awesome meals outside.

Nocturnals: One of a kind session where day and night are flipped flopped. Stay up all night to learn about night science and sleep during the day. Breakfast for dinner is what's cooking!

Advanced Sailing: Work with a certified instructor to get your own certification so you can sail anywhere. Captain your own vessel and work toward certification.

Canoe North Idaho: Offered every other year (and this is the year!). Set out on a three day adventure down the St. Joe River.

Advanced Windsurfing: Tackle the next step in windsurfing. Tack upwind and go on an epic adventure using the wind as your guide.

Hot August Nights: The lake is warm and C4E is revved up. Sleep inside or outside, spend the entire day on the lake playing water volleyball or out in a canoe.

“Our resident camp is one of the premier outdoor camps in the region because it's on the lake, the cabins and lodge are unique and the activities we provide are geared for girls of all ages who want to have a memorable summer camp experience,” said Jayn “Handy” Courchaine, Camp Four Echoes camp director. “The waterfront is really the hub of activity for every session because we have canoes, kayaks, paddle boats, funyaks, windsurfing and sailing equipment that campers can learn to use or advance their skills.”

The unique themed weeks sell out early because girls return year after year to participate. You do not have to be a Girl Scout to attend Camp Four Echoes; you just have to be a girl! Discounts apply for Girl Scout members. The price per session ranges from \$190-\$540 depending on the length, the session theme and the supplies or equipment required.
