Girl Scouts Camp Four Echoes on Lake Coeur d'Alene Summer Sessions Open Now

(Spokane, Wash.—March 15, 2012): Summer session registration for Girl Scouts Eastern Washington and Northern Idaho (GSEWNI) Camp Four Echoes on Lake Coeur d'Alene in northern Idaho is open now! The seven themed weeks include sessions for all girls in grades 1 through 12.

“Being at camp is always a memory maker for the girls,” said Jayn Courchaine, Camp Four Echoes camp director. “The bonus this year is that girls will be at camp during Girl Scouts’ Centennial year. We’ve still got all the amazing things that girls expect with camp plus many extras, new session features and of course some Centennial surprises.”

The first camp session is the week of June 24-29 and the last session is August 5-10, 2012. Themes include: Explore the Arts, Let Freedom Ring, The Great Outdoors, Women Pioneers, Nocturnals (a very popular session), CFE Olympics and Buggin’Out. Camp Four Echoes can accommodate up to 130 girls per week.

An expanded troop camping option allows groups of girls and volunteers to come to camp for 2-5 days, accommodate up to 24 girls per group and can include outside organizations such as dance, cheerleader, sports teams and other team building elements.

Camp Four Echoes is situated on 212 wooded acres along majestic Lake Coeur d'Alene in Worley, Idaho. The new 11,500 square foot \$3.4 million lodge houses the dining hall, commercial kitchen, meeting rooms, an infirmary, bunk rooms (which sleep 16), a camp trading post and a science lab. Girl Scouts have whiled away the summer at Girl Scout camp since 1938. The camp offers supervised boating, kayaking, sailing, windsurfing, canoeing, swimming, hiking, camping under the stars, singing, crafting, exploring, science lab and nearly one mile of private lakefront for girls to enjoy all summer.

Girls who register early will receive a 20 percent discount off the session price. The discount applies through March 31 with the code “EARLY.” Interested girls can register online at www.CampFourEchoes.com.
