




















Earn a badge or patch

If a Girl Scout wants to bring a friend who isn't a current Girl Scout, the friend needs to add the \$35 Girl Scout membership fee to the event fee and they can participate in the events for the membership year.

The Volunteer symbol appears when adults can expect that the program will actively engage them. If a program does not have an Volunteer symbol, unless otherwise noted, girls still require a chaperone, but you can expect your role to be just that.



#### LASER INTERFEROMETER GRAVITATIONAL-WAVE OBSERVATORY & &







Visit the Laser Interferometer Gravitational-Wave Observatory where scientists work to detect gravitational waves, predicted by Einstein's General Theory of Relativity. LIGO'S multi-kilometer-scale gravitational wave detectors use laser interferometry to measure the minute ripples in space-time, caused by passing gravitational waves from cataclysmic cosmic events, such as a colliding neutron stars or black holes. Once you earn the main patch, continue to improve your skills, and earn up to four bells to celebrate being at the "top" of four levels of climbing: beginner, advanced beginner, intermediate, and advanced. Brownies, Juniors, Cadettes, Seniors, Ambassadors
