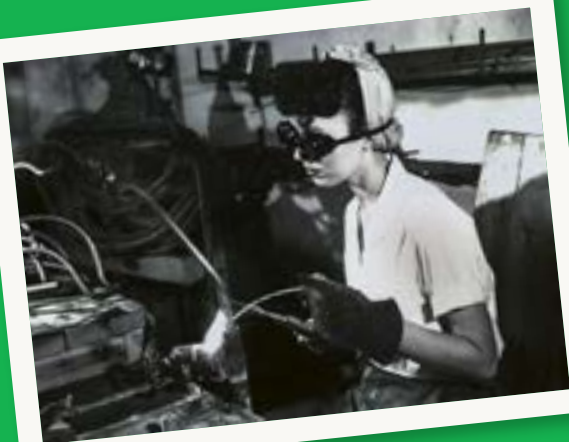




Manhattan Project Patch Program
